Iin Pendleton is a nationally recognized oil painter with award winning paintings in galleries and collections from coast to coast. Elin is a full member of the American Academy of Equine Art, the International Society of Acrylic Painters, and the Women Artists of the West, Inc. A traditionally trained artist with a BA in Fine Art from San Diego State University, Elin has been painting since the age of nine and selling her paintings since 1983. She was recognized when she was in her teens for her artistic talent by the late Millard Sheets, and since then she has studied and painted in South America, Central America and Mediterranean Europe. Her award-winning paintings are found in both private and corporate collections throughout the United States and Europe. She has studied with noted artists Richard Schmid, Al Brouilette, Joyce Pike, Robert E. Wood, and Ovanes Berberian.

In addition, she is a skilled teacher and conducts workshops for aspiring painters. She markets her work primarily through her web sites, and higher-end galleries. Elin is the author of one of the newest books from Walter Foster, Horses in Acrylics, as well as three instructional videos. Her painting, "Paros, Three Boats," has been published in Exploring Color, Nita Leland's revised edition published by North Light. Other paintings have been featured in the Artists Magazine, Art Talk, and Horses in Art magazines.

She lives with her husband who is a university professor and a variety of domestic animals (horses, goats, dogs, cats, chickens) all of which have found their way into her paintings.

"I have always been an artist as far back as I can remember. I studied art all through high school and junior college until the Army drafted me in 1972. While in the Army, I did art work for our battalion and for our base commander, Col. Parker, great-grandson of Commander Chief, Quannah Parker. After returning from the military, I completed my Associates degree in Art and transferred to California State University, Fullerton, where I received my Bachelor's of Art in Art.

Over the years, I've worked in a variety of media. I began with pencil and watercolor, then progressed through acrylics, inks, enamels, and oils. I've carved, tooled and painted leather art goods, airbrushed art on vans and motorcycles, worked in ceramics, and carved and cast rings in silver and gold.

Since my first show a the age of 15, I've been selling my artwork. I was a partner in a leather art business and also in the Genesis Art Gallery in Pomona. I did freelance work for such companies and organizations as Vons, Peterson Publications, and the Mormon Church. For 10 years, I had my own screen printing and airbrushing business.

In 2003, I retired from my day job so that I'd be able to have more time to create artwork for myself. My paintings, most recently, deal with ancient civilizations and belief systems with the phenomina of ufo's and their interconnection throughout history. My work is created to simulate the viewer's imagination and curiosity, while communicating my ideas and concepts of specific times and places in many civilizations.
