DEMONSTRATOR

JIM BURNS HIGHLIGHTS

Im Burns' love of the graphic arts, as expressed in his watercolor landscapes and seascapes, shows evidence of his years in the architectural profession which commenced in the early 1950's. His paintings often exhibit a disciplined approach to design and painting technique, no doubt influenced by the profession. In 1984, Jim Burns redirected much of his energy from architecture to watercolor paintings, and has received high acclaim from art show jurists, art teachers and his peers. Mr. Burns has benefited from high quality instruction and inspiration from fine artists such as Gerald Brommer, Don O'Neill, Milford Zornes, Robert Landry and Jack Sheppard. Early art training was highly influenced Sam Hyde Harris in the World War 2 years, and by the famed architectural illustrator Siegfried Knop in the 1960's.

Jim Burns is a member of Mid-Valley Arts League, San Gabriel Valley Fine Arts Association, and Associated Artists of the Inland Empire. He exhibited at the Art-A Fair in Laguna Beach in 1987 and 1988. Mr Burns' studio is in his home in Pasadena, where most of his paintings are done. On-location paintings and photographs from travel, field trips and workshops form a majority of visual information for his paintings, although imagination has recently proven to be a successful source for subject matter. Jim's paintings are typically "easy to live with" representations of natural beauty and man in harmony with creation, and are not painted to evoke an emotionally stressful response. It is so much more rewarding to Jim to concentrate on the beautiful aspects of our world and to try to capture the essence of each subject in positive terms. Since 1991, Mr. Burns has found great enjoyment through teaching his painting skills through demonstrations to art groups.
