**DEMONSTRATOR**

**FEALING LIN HIGHLIGHTS**

**A**ward-winning watercolorist, Fealing Lin of San Marino, California, was born in Taiwan and began her journey into artistic expression as a protégé of renowned professor Ching-Jung Chen in Taiwan, subsequently pursuing her career in the United States with watercolorist and senior art historian professor Verna Wells.

With a fluidity of colors, Ms. Lin combines realism, impressionistic strokes, and semi-abstract techniques to elicit life and movement in her floral and landscape watercolors. Her paintings adorn the paper with both harmony and emotion.

Although briefly diverted from her passion by a family tradition of medicine and dentistry, Fealing ultimately abandoned her tray of instruments and high-speed drills in favor of her pallet and brushes. In just a few short years, her paintings have been widely recognized and exhibited.

Said Professor William Blackshaw, President of the Royal Watercolor Society of England, "Fealing Lin paints poems that vibrate with light and color... long may she continue to delight the eye and move the spirit."

"My passion for watercolor", says Ms. Lin, "comes from the opportunity it gives me to be totally spontaneous in the pursuit of traditional watercolor transparency which is the "glow" from the white paper that emerges through the paint once a fusion occurs from the application of wet onto wet".

Now a teacher, demonstrator, and active exhibitor, Fealing is an annual guest instructor at Yosemite National Park, an instructor at Brand Library in Glendale, Pasadena Community College, and also at her converted home studio. She is an

## GAYLE STRATFORD

Gayle Stratford recalls her first awareness that she possessed a unique ability for art when she was seven. The class assignment was to copy a picture of Santa Claus from the blackboard. The admiration others had for her efforts inspired her to hone those drawing skills. From the very beginning her favorite subject matter was people. Gayle also has enjoyed a lifelong interest in dance and music. She plays the piano and violin, and dabbles in other instruments.

While earning her BA at Brigham Young University, Gayle used their vast resources to explore every possible type of media. From drawing, painting and design to printmaking, and sculpting both by casting in bronze and carving from the stones she quarried in Southern Utah she learned that her favorite media was oil paint.

Gayle met her mentor and most influential teacher while attending Brandes Art Institute (which is now California Art Institute). Fred Fixler relentlessly pounded into his students the need for accuracy, value control, massing, planes, beautiful edges, etc.

After 3 years of art school, Gayle took a hiatus from her artistic pursuits in favor of raising a family. Gayle and her husband Scott have five children, who have been ambitious in the areas of dance, music, and theater.

Resuming her own pursuits now with 3 kids off to college and two teens at home, Gayle has again turned her attention to art. She has been concentrating on oil painting and has taken many workshops.

Teaching is also a rewarding facet of Gayle's artistic pursuit. She teaches a head drawing class at the RC Center, as well as organizing a workshop at the Fillippi Winery Art Gallery. Gayle participates in the monthly Associated Artist's Artwork of the month, and has won an award four times this year. With all that she has accomplished Gayle has a goal to eventually establish a daily painting schedule to create a body of work suitable for galleries and publishing.

Fealing still lives in San Marino with her husband, her youngest son, her dog - Husker, and cat - Olive.
